Some of you may not know, but Unleashed Agility has moved to a new venue. This is about \$10,000 dollars income for the year. We have many ways to make up the money, but the club will need volunteers to work the new events we are scheduling.

At agility trials we have many exhibitors who work, both members and non members. We make more income with Barnhunt and Nose work trials, but often these trials do not allow exhibitors to work. We will need other volunteers to work.

One of the first chances to help is the UKC Ohio Classic show on March 22-23-24, 2019. If we can help we will make \$5,000. We need 12 volunteers per day plus drivers to pick up the Judges and return them to the hotel. If interested please put these dates on your calendar. Watch for e-mails after the first of the year to see what exactly we need.

We also would like to expand our Barnhunt trials. Barnhunt is an activity where we have great help over the weekend. There seems to be help in setup and tear down, but few club members help during the trial. To expand to two rings we will need a lot more help.

Remember 50% of our revenue comes from shows and seminars. If you have a money making idea please submit a proposal to the Board. It is important to watch for emails that tell you what is going on at the club during the month, and please set aside a few hours to help the club with the activities.

The A-frame is heavy - you arrange transport.

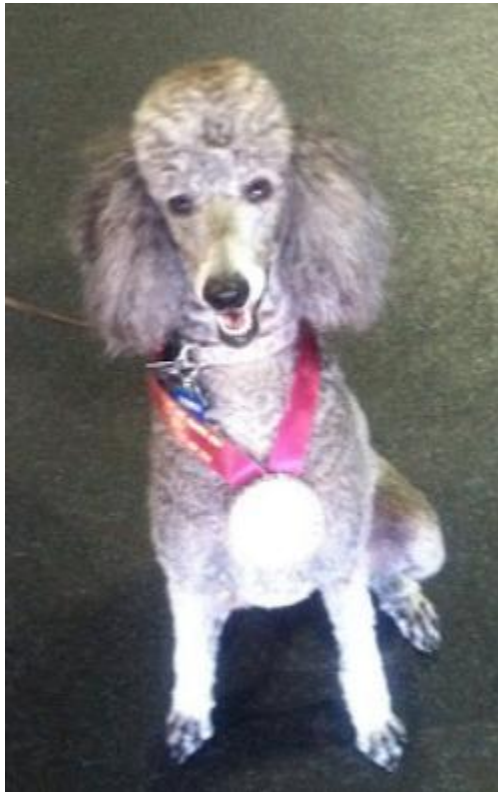

CPE TV

June 8th, 2018 Press Release.

During the first morning briefing of CPE (Canine Performance Events) Nationals, the joint project between CPE and Eclectic Productions was announced - CPE TV.

CPE TV is an online video channel showcasing everything CPE. The first offering found on the newly formed website was CPE Nationals live streaming. Over the first weekend of live streaming, there were over 22k views with glowing reviews. The two main rings inside the big building were featured - one on Twitter and one thru Facebook. The award ceremonies were also live streamed with the addition of a third, on the main floor feed. Live feeds will occur throughout the year at sporadic trials.

The website currently has video info explaining the 7 classes offered at CPE trials. Trial locations will be added as info is obtained. Specific CPE related events, instruction or information will be posted throughout the year and added as need is determined. Suggestions are always welcome.

Beginning with the 2018 Nationals a new web based series featuring CPE clubs will be introduced. Filming has concluded for the Nationals event and the scheduled date for release is September 1st, 2018. This series will feature clubs from around the country. It will be a 20 minute show with the first 10 minutes showing the club and a trial. The next 5 minutes will showcase the town or area the club is in and the last 5 minutes will showcase a local rescue or other dog related non-profit. Sponsorship opportunities are available.

Canine agility is an amazing sport where dogs and handlers work as a team to navigate an obstacle course. The dogs never test the actual trial course, they have one shot to do it correctly. It's up to the handler to instruct and direct them on the correct path. It's a very unique team sport. Add to that a great social aspect for humans and dogs alike. There are multiple venues offering canine agility but CPE offers something for everyone in a welcoming environment with competition and camaraderie.

BOARD PROPOSAL CHANGE TO STANDING RULES

This is the wording proposed to be added to the Standing Rules:

Member Benefits

As a benefit to all members, CCDTC offers:

- A lower rate for classes than what the general public pays.
- Key for access to the CCDTCBuilding.
- Use of Equipment and Ring TimeTraining

As an incentive to instructors, each instructor is approved to work their own dog during the class they instruct for no fee. If an instructor is not running a dog in the class they are teaching they will be offered a voucher for one run/class in a trial/show or one training class.

Key Event Worker Benefits

Key Event Workers are the members who run and manage a trial/event. The duties of these workers are outlined in the Member Benefits document. The Member Benefits document also outlines the requirement for becoming a key worker for an event venue and associated benefits. For each Key Event Worker the club covers the entry fees of runs for 1-2 dogs (depending on venue as outlined in the Member Benefits document).

These benefits apply only after member hours have been achieved.

Member Benefits

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Key Event Workers are the members who run and manage a trial/event. The duties of these workers are outlined in the Job Descriptions documents above.

Any member can become a key worker by:

- gaining experience over years by attending trials
- becoming familiar with the rules of the venue and the club
- learning the ins and outs of the venue
- helping in minor roles to learn more about the venue

CPE:

- For each event the club cover the entry fees of runs for 2 dogs.
- If the trial is full, the Key Event Workers pay for their runs. If the trial is NOT full, they are given the option of taking advantage of the runs.
- Additionally, CPE has an allowance for overruns, but these runs are NOT allowed to be added to the entry numbers that constitute a full trial. The judges and Key Event Workers can use these extra runs for their dogs.

Barn Hunt:

- For Key Event Workers the club covers the entry fees for one set of runs for one dog.

UKC:

- For Key Event Workers the club covers the entry fees associated of 2 dogs per show.

UpDog:

- For Key Event Workers the club covers the entry fees associated for runs for one dog.
- UpDog Fees are paid by the Key Event Workers if applicable.
- (UpDog has a \$400.00 run fee cap. Key Event Workers are not charged for runs if that cap has been exceeded.)

If a person works as a key event worker in a venue where they are not showing a dog they will be offered a voucher for one dog entry into a trial/show or a training class.

(These benefits apply only after member hours have been achieved)

Any member can become a key worker by:

- gaining experience over years by attending trials
- becoming familiar with the rules of the venue and the club
- learning the ins and outs of the venue
- helping in minor roles to learn more about the venue

Worker Bucks for CPE and Barn Hunt

- Worker Bucks are for members and non-members who volunteer to help with the general running of the trial.
- Without these workers, the club would not be able to hold these events and/or they would run so poorly that they would not be regularly attended.
- Worker Bucks are NOT to be substituted for hours worked toward the required 16 Club workhours.
- A worker buck consists of \$2.00/ class worked.
- The worker bucks can be used to help pay for future entry fees or to purchase lunch at events.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO STANDING RULES

The following statement is being proposed by Carole and Rod Steele and Georgia Peck as an addition to the Board proposal on this matter.

" The corporation shall not pay any judges fee or other fee to any club, corporation, or entity as part of a Trial or Show entry registration for any member receiving compensated runs."

We are holding a Show-n-Go on Friday and Saturday and a Sniff -n-Go on Sunday.

We have been asked to be a part of the UKC Ohio Classic on March 22, 23, and 24, 2019. The UKC will be taking our conformation date and hosting an event at the Roberts Center in Wilmington. We will receive compensation for providing help for the events.

Positions we need to fill are as follows:

1. Judge transport airport to hotel only. UKC using on site hotel judges.
2. 1 basic hospitality. UKC using event center catering for lunches, etc.
3. Ring stewards Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

4. 4 conformation rings (1 steward each ring), 1 rally/obedience ring (3stewards) and 1 nosework ring (4 stewards).

Volunteers may enter and show with a possible reduced rate (depends on contract). Conformation stewards are asked to not enter under the judge for whom they are stewarding. Stewarding assignments may be scheduled as all day or shifts.

We will need captains for 1. Conformation, 2. Rally/Obedience, 3. Nosework . The capatin will be responsible for one venue. They will coordinate the workers for the venue and make sure the rings are staffed as needed. Susan will be the "Head Captain" overseeing all of the workers and our UKC contact. Please contact Susan if you would like to volunteer to be a captain or to work at the event.

Since the UKC is taking our March date Susan will be scheduling a UKC conformation event in late summer/early fall of 2019.
